Belated congratulations to Whimbrel LA, for it successfully made its way back to Eighty Mile Beach on 7 October. After staying in Papua New Guinea for 38 days, LA set off south-east in the evening of 4 October with an average speed of 44km/h. In less than 2.5 days' LA arrived precisely back home to its favourite place: 40-50km south of the Anna Plains Station entrance on Eighty Mile Beach.
