Status:

Summer breeder on stony shores, passage migrant and winter visitor on mud flats, estuaries and coastal wetlands, occasionally inland.

Identification features:

- . Small and compact
- . Stubby bill
- . Wing bar in flight
- Orange an black bill in summer black in winter
- . Call a two note 'poo-eep'

Something to appreciate:

Ringed Plovers are famous for their broken wing display which they use to lure predators away from their nest and chicks.
